Mathematics

Grade 1 students

- count to 100 in different ways (e.g., skip-counting by 5s and 10s)
- show, describe and compare quantities to 20
- recognize groups of 1–10 objects at a glance
- understand and apply [strategies](#) for addition [facts](#) up to and including $9 + 9$ and related subtraction facts
- recall addition facts to a sum of 5 and related subtraction facts
- solve a problem and talk about how they did it and why
- connect numbers to everyday life, such as while reading a story or solving problems that involve the number of people in their family
- recognize and create repeating patterns
- sort objects, using one characteristic, and explain the sorting rule
- compare, sort and reproduce 2-D shapes and 3-D objects
- use measurements to order and compare objects
